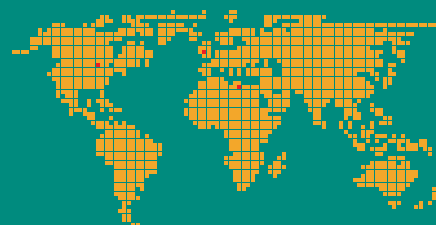

We too are passionate about our quest and have not reneged on it. We need you to be present with us and bless in spirit the work of our hands. ”

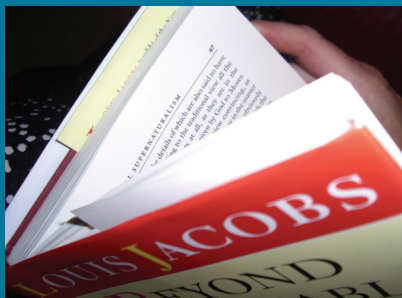
Rabbi Wittenberg, together with Rabbi Reuven Hammer of New London and members of the Jacobs family, subsequently developed this programme in order to spread the knowledge of Rabbi Jacobs ideas to the widest possible public.

The Reading Rabbi Jacobs year will be split into four readings. Participants (Readers) are invited to read the specific book/s for that term.

Your specific questions and comments can be addressed on line and other Readers and Scholars invited to respond. Reviews and information on the books in question will also be published on the web site.

During the reading period Readers will be encouraged to hold local get together to study, discuss and feedback via the web site.

In traditional fashion, when a community completes a study course, a Siyyum is held. These evenings will be addressed by Scholars who will have been involved with the local groups, the web site and, most likely, will have studied with Rabbi Jacobs.



Reading Rabbi Jacobs is open to all. Whatever your religious affiliation, whether or not you have little or much knowledge of theology, participation only requires your interest. This series is in honour of Rabbi Jacobs who was interested in helping concerned Jews in the quest for Jewish knowledge.

Rabbinic students and colleagues of Rabbi Jacobs will lead the programme that will consist of participation via multi media and dialogue sessions:-

- Introduction at a Melaveh Malkah at The New London Synagogue (other venues to be announced on the web site) – 8.15pm on Motzei Shabbat 4th November 2006. First Reading – **We Have Reason To Believe** with the addition of **Beyond Reasonable Doubt** to those familiar with the former.
- Siyyum Sunday 3rd December at 8.00 and Introduction to the Second Reading – **A Jewish Theology**
- Siyyum late February 2007 and Introduction to the Third Reading – **Rabbinic Thought in The Talmud**
- Siyyim mid April 2007 and Introduction to the Fourth Reading – **A Tree of Life** and **God, Torah, Israel.**
- Siyyum 29th June to mark the series completion and a ‘Where do we go from here discussion’
